

**REGULAR BOARD MEETING
VILLAGE OF TEUTOPOLIS
SEPTEMBER 07, 2022**

The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Teutopolis, Effingham County, State of Illinois, was held in the Village Hall of said Village, September 07, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.

The President called the meeting to order and upon roll call the following trustees were present:

It was moved by Bernard Hartke, seconded by David Tegeler and carried that the minutes of the last meeting be approved as presented.

Lee Beckman from Milano & Grunloh was present to update the board on the ITEP grant the Village will be applying for. The ITEP application must be submitted by September 30, 2022. The Village will now work on gathering letters of support from local businesses and residents. Once the letters are gathered, they will be sent along with the application.

Shelby Dupont with CQI Associates, LLC explained the Village Residential and Small Business Municipal Aggregation Program Assessment. The current electrical aggregation rates the Village has for residential and small business will expires in December of 2022. She said the electrical aggregation rate will be much higher than our previous contract with Homefield Energy. She is checking the markets daily to try and secure us the best rate possible for the Village. The board approved that Village Clerk, Amy Vahling could sign a three-year agreement if Shelby is able to secure a good rate.

Courtney Yockey was present to let the board know there will be a Zoom meeting on September 29th at 2:00 p.m. to discuss Green Energy.

Prairie View residents Courtney Yockey and Jamie Niemerg were present to ask the board for approval so they can shut down Morning Glory Lane. They would like this street shut down so they can host a neighborhood block party. The board agreed to let them shut the road down for the party.

Motion by Daniel Zerrusen, seconded by Jane Summers to pass Resolution No. 651, A Resolution for Funding Support for Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program Cycle 15-2022 Grant Project (Village committing up to 20% for the ITEP Project). Roll call vote – 5 yes, 0 nays, 1 absent, motion carried.

Motion by Daniel Zerrusen, seconded by Bernard Hartke to approve the Milano & Grunloh Unsewered Grant Application for Engineering Services. Roll call vote – 5 yes, 0 nays, 1 absent, motion carried.

Motion by Daniel Zerrusen, seconded by Bernard Hartke to accept the Live360 health insurance plan for the employees for the plan year October 01, 2022 to September 30, 2023. Roll call vote – 5 yes, 0 nays, 1 absent, motion carried.


The board agreed to have South Central Regional Planning & Development Commission complete the TIF reporting to the Illinois Comptroller for the plan year of May 01, 2021 through April 30, 2022.

The board discussed creating an ordinance that would require all inground swimming pools to have a fence around the pool. The Village Attorney will be contacted to help create a draft ordinance so the board can start discussing at a meeting in the near future.


The board discussed implementing a solar ordinance within the Village and extra territorial area limits. The board instructed the Village Clerk to contact the Village Attorney and have her present the board with a draft of a solar ordinance so they can start discussing this issue.

In other action, the board reviewed the Motor Fuel Tax Compliance Review from January 01, 2021 through December 31, 2021 and this was put on file, discussed the Route 40 shoulder project and the repairs that are being made, decided to wait to make a decision on the ditch/creek area by Mainz Circle until they spoke with Carl Pals, Item j on the agenda was tabled until the next meeting, Trick or Treat will be scheduled for October 28th from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. and the board decided to make two amendments to the recreational vehicle ordinance to allow golf cart to be out until 9:00 p.m. on the Village's trick or treat night and allow recreational vehicle's to cross at all roads crossing the highway.

It was moved by Daniel Zerrusen, seconded by Jane Summers and carried to adjourn the meeting.
