

**REGULAR BOARD MEETING
VILLAGE OF TEUTOPOLIS
NOVEMBER 01, 2023**

The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Teutopolis, Effingham County, State of Illinois, was held in the Village Hall of said Village, on November 01, 2023, at 7:00 p.m.

The President called the meeting to order and upon roll call the following trustees were present:

It was moved by Greg Oseland, seconded by Daniel Zerrusen, and carried that the minutes of the last meeting be approved as presented.

Building Official Tony Esker reported 2 new building permits.

President Repking reported for Village Foreman Carl Pals. First, he reported the new backhoe shipped and we should receive it by November 12th. Secondly, Carl would like to trade the John Deere gas riding mower in for a diesel-powered mower. The board asked President Repking to obtain more information on the current mower and report back. Lastly, some repairs are needed on Water Street just east of Harvester Street. A portion of this street has sunk about 1 ½ inches within the last week. President Repking will speak with Carl and see if these repairs need to be completed immediately or can wait until Spring.

Lee Beckman from Milano & Grunloh gave updates on the pending grant applications. He reported the preliminary engineering is near completion for the ITEP grant, the NOFO for the unsewered grant should be soon, and the STAG cast iron grant if funded, would be a 2025 project. He also gave an update on our \$200,316 in STU funds. These funds can help with the engineering fees for the intersection replacement project. The proposed intersections to be replaced with STU funds would be Race Street and Main Street, Plum Street and Main Street, Washington Street and Main Street, Columbus Street and Main Street, and Wall Street and Main Street.


The Board and Chief Bushue discussed inoperable motor vehicles. It is against the Code for any resident to keep inoperable vehicles in their driveway longer than seven days. If the vehicle cannot be fixed within that period, it would have to be stored in a garage. Chief Bushue will contact individuals who are violating the Code.

Motion by Daniel Zerrusen, seconded by Greg Oseland, to pay Farmweld \$127,947.36 on TIF 2 Farmweld/Canarm Agreement Number 3. Roll call vote – 6 yes, 0 nays, motion carried.


In other action, the board discussed the need to purchase a new squad car soon, body and in-car cameras for the police, and two trustees will meet with Carl Pals to discuss engineering services.
